



KANTHA PATCHED CUSHION

You will need

- * fabric for front (I used two main panels for the front and lots of scraps for the patches)
- * fabric for back
- * iron
- * pins
- * needle
- * thread (I used pale pink, pale blue, pink and gold)
- * sewing machine and thread
- * cushion stuffing



I've been to India for work and it's a pretty breathtaking place. During these travels my love affair with textiles reached giddying new heights. India is colour and pattern heaven and after visiting many textile retailers and manufacturers, I fell in love with kantha quilts. The quilts are made from layers of brightly coloured recycled saris, which are patched together and then stitched over the top with rows and rows of tiny running stitches. This creates a beautiful texture to the quilt, and no two are ever the same.

I bought a few quilts to keep for myself, but that wasn't enough to satisfy my obsession, so I started patching together some scraps of fabric to make my own. Perhaps I was blindly optimistic, but I didn't realise how timeconsuming it would be. It wasn't long before the project was downsized to a cushion.

NOTE / My finished cushion is approximately 50 cm (19¾ in) square; make your cushion any size, to suit whatever fabric scraps you have.
